Pony Club: The mission statement of the United States Pony Clubs is to provide a program for youth that teaches riding, mounted sports and the care of horses and ponies, thereby developing responsibility, moral judgement, leadership, and self-confidence. The Jefferson County Fair invites members of the Pony Clubs in Jefferson County to participate in activities and classes offered during the Fair.

General Rules:

1. Pony Club participants can earn premiums in the five riding classes offered, for Herdsmanship, Unmounted Demonstrations, and for Educational Displays. All entries will be judged by USPC Standards. Premium money can be picked up at the Fair Office after 3 p.m. Sunday.
2. The United States Pony Club Guidelines, Fair Policies and The National Show Ring Code of Ethics will be enforced.
3. The Fair Horse Barn Superintendent reserves the right to disqualify any horse entry for justifiable cause. Any unmanageable horse or pony will be asked to leave the Fair.
4. All participants are required to attend an orientation meeting prior to the Fair, which will be set up by the Superintendent.
5. Herdsmanship is required by all participants. Barn guidelines will be posted.
6. Each animal entered is required to have a completed open class stall card in view.
7. Veterinary inspection is mandatory for all horses staying on the grounds. Horses will be checked between 6-7 p.m., Thursday evening. Check with the coordinator for location upon arrival.
8. Refer to the Animal Health Requirements section in the Open Class section of this book.
9. Hold Harmless: Every entry at the show shall constitute an agreement, making owner, rider, etc. aware and subject to local show rules. All entries agree to hold harmless for any action and releases the Jefferson County Fair from all liabilities of any kind or character for loss, damage or injury to horses, drivers, riders or any other property that said owner may have on the grounds for the show.

ENTRY PROCEDURE:

1. Use the Jefferson County Open Class Animal Entry Form. Entries will be accepted as space permits, first come-first serve.
2. All entries will be required to pay a grounds fee of five dollars per animal exhibited. Fee must be sent with entry.
3. Mail entries to the Jefferson County Fair- PO Box 242, Port Townsend, WA 98368, by July 15th.

4. Activity Schedules will be mailed to all registered participants.

General Rules:

1. Pony Club members are encouraged to enter an educational display in the Fair. Displays will be educational and relate to Pony Club Activities or Equine Education.
2. Entries can be in the form of a poster, wall mounted display, table display (space permitting) or hanging mobile. (Contact the Superintendent to reserve large display areas).
3. Entries can be listed on the animal entry form or in the Fair office prior to Thursday 9 p.m.
4. Exhibits need to be brought to the Fair Exhibitor Station in the Oscar Erickson Building for entry and judging.
5. Please include a 3x5 card listing your name, age, club and rating level with your display, or write this information on the back of your poster.
6. Entries will be displayed during the Fair and will need to be picked up after 6 p.m. Sunday after the Fair closes.
7. Premium points and ribbons will be awarded.
